

It's official—we're spending this Easter Season walking through the Resurrection story with scripture in one hand and a playlist from the 70s



If you missed the first two weeks, no worries—you've still got time to catch the groove. We began with U2's *I Still Haven't Found What I'm Looking For*, where Mary Magdalene and the disciples come to the tomb expecting to find the body of their Lord... and found only linen and mystery. The search for Jesus continued until finally Mary found what she was looking for!

Then came Queen and David Bowie's *Under Pressure*, echoing in the background as the disciples lock themselves away in fear. In that tight, anxious space—where "the terror of knowing what the world is about" feels all too real—Jesus enters anyway. He offers peace. He offers presence.

And like the song says, he gives love another chance... and another... and another.

Now that we're cruising into May, I thought I'd offer a sneak peek into the next four weeks. Of course, I won't just tell you what songs are coming (what would be the fun in that?). Instead, you're invited to decode these delightfully subtle hints.

Week 3: We'll cast our nets wide in John 21, where fish are caught, breakfast is served, and love is asked and answered not once, not twice, but three times. This one calls for someone reliable—someone who'll remind you they're always there, even when you're running on empty. A friend to lean on, perhaps?

Week 4: In John 10, we'll lean in and listen for the voice of the Good Shepherd. He calls us by name, cuts through the static, and leads us through the noise. You might want to follow your heart on this one... just listen closely.

Week 5: Just when things seem to settle down, Jesus hits us with a new commandment: love one another. But this isn't the polite, Hallmark-card kind of love. It's wild, unpredictable, and definitely not easy to define. Sounds like the kind of love that might drive you a little crazy.

So, bring your curiosity, your love of good music, and maybe your best guess at this week's tune. Whether you've been here every week or are just jumping in, there's a place for you in this season. Come for the scripture, stay for the surprise... and maybe hum a tune on your way out. The tomb is still empty, the stone is still rolled, and the beat goes on.
